

#### **Our People**

YSC aims to value and maximize the skills of its board, staff, and volunteers. Key actions include formalizing HR policies, creating clear job descriptions, developing a volunteer engagement framework, implementing succession planning, and focusing on professional and personal development.

## **Our Programs**

With the challenges of reduced registrations and diversity gaps, YSC plans to enhance program relevancy and reach. Initiatives include developing an Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Accessibility (IDEA) plan, leveraging technology, creating inter-divisional learning opportunities, expanding the Residency Program, and exploring strategic partnerships.

#### **Our Finances**

To support program growth and facility maintenance, YSC focuses on diversifying revenue streams. This includes developing a comprehensive fund development program, engaging alumni in philanthropy, maximizing facility usage for revenue generation, and executing a long-term financial plan.

#### **Our Profile**

YSC aims to enhance its community profile and position itself as a leader in the choral industry. This involves developing a communications plan, establishing consistent messaging, increasing public awareness of its facilities, and strengthening community partnerships.

# **Our Operations**

As YSC evolves, it will strengthen its operational foundation. Plans include adopting a governance model, developing a building plan for the APAC, implementing a program operations management system, conducting risk assessments, and enhancing IT systems.

# MESSAGE FROM FOUNDER & CDO

Much of my effort and time is spent on stewardship with past, current, and prospective donors and sponsors. It was a challenging but successful year in Fund Development. We received a grant that enabled us to focus on our alumni development goals.

We established a volunteer alumni committee to continue building our YSC alumni opportunities and activities. Grantsmanship and grant reporting continued successfully with the Government and the Foundations.




Our Fund Development committee met regularly, and we added several YSC parents to the team under the leadership of Dr Laura Hambley. We focussed on revenue generation for the HEARTS OUT Gala and were thrilled with the final amount raised. The committee also assisted in several other fund-generation activities. The Gala continues to give us a vehicle to contact corporations for financial assistance. Individuals and businesses give generously to our outstanding auction. We are back to pre-pandemic levels of funding in most areas.

Our Annual Giving Campaign, launched in December with Giving Tuesday, allowed all of you to support YSC, an amazing charity that focuses on youth but also serves all ages and abilities. Gaming, both Bingos and a Casino, raised substantial funds for YSC this season. None of the above much-needed revenue could have been raised without YSC's host of committed volunteers, who made it all happen with the assistance of professional staff at the office. Several smaller fundraisers also helped us reach our total revenue goals for the season.

We have more work to do next year to build our raffle revenue. Imagine we raised over \$800,000 (not including earned revenue from tuition, rentals, and performances). THANK YOU TO EVERY ONE OF YOU!! We have balanced our books once again. Our continued challenge is to support capital costs. We have \$1.2 Million to complete paying for our building. Once that has occurred, YSC can use the current interest payments to operate our fantastic programs. A little detour for capital is our current need for a new roof, which must occur during this season. All detailed financial information is included in our '23-24 Financial Statements.

# ATCO PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE (APAC)

#### **APAC Welcomes New and Returning Renters**

The 2023-2024 season was an exciting one for APAC, with fifteen new organizations renting our facility. These included:

- Fencing competitions
- Spelling bees
- Performing arts groups
- Immigrant Association
- Choral Associations

Several long-term performing groups continued to use APAC as their rehearsal space, and the building remained busy every weekend with rentals or division workshops. We also created a new practice room with a piano to support one-on-one lessons, expanding our offerings.





## **Building Community Through Rentals**

APAC's studios, practice rooms, and board rooms have not only generated income but have also created a strong sense of community. Calgary's arts organizations often struggle to find affordable, high-quality spaces for their work. APAC offers a professional environment where:

- Creativity can flourish
- Connections are made
- The arts community can thrive

In a city where renting community centers or church basements is often the norm, APAC provides a vital space for the performing arts to grow and develop.

# Office Space Renovations

Thanks to a generous donation of office furniture from Office Concepts, APAC received a much-needed update. Staff and volunteers worked hard, painting and preparing the space for the arrival of new desks, chairs, and supplies. This renovation helped refresh the workspace for the season ahead.

## Crowdfunding Success for "Raise the Roof" Campaign

In partnership with the Government of Alberta, we launched a successful crowdfunding campaign to repair leaks in the APAC roof. Thanks to overwhelming community support, we reached our matching fund goal and continue to seek additional donations to complete all necessary repairs.

Media coverage from CTV and CityTV helped highlight how important APAC is to Calgary's performing arts community, and we were thrilled by the outpouring of support.

#### A Miraculous Year

Thanks to our amazing Artistic Team, our incredible volunteers and our very talented singers, we experienced a very successful year. As a creative team, it was a fun and memorable journey for us to plan a parade and re-envision our Prisma show.

Our first semester focused on the planning, preparation and performance of our December mainstage show, "A Miracle on Mainstreet". We loved incorporating all of the aspects of a parade - the route, the dancers, the music and the characters. This theme inspired our music, choreography and wardrobe. Our actors tied it all up with a bow.



Our spring season's goal was to revisit Prisma, the show that was never performed in 2020. Very quickly in the process, we realized that the show we created was no longer relevant to our youth. # The Meaning Behind the Art

"I wanted the overall image to evoke the exuberance and energy that fills this building," says Clark. On the left side, he "peeled away" the outer layer of the wall to create the illusion of peering inside, revealing musical elements and motifs. As the design evolves into abstraction, whimsical characters perform with love and joy, symbolizing the strength of the YSC community.

- Butterflies symbolize transformation, confidence, and growth.
- A rainbow-winged bird represents the harmony of a "community of voices."
- A gift box reminds us of the friendships and rewards of being present and involved.
